## Alternatives To Mandatory Spay/Neuter Legislation

- 1. Provide lists of pet-friendly housing in the area.
- 2. Provide information on responsible pet ownership.
- 3. Provide lists of trainers to help owners with behavioral problems and for general obedience training.
- 4. Provide city- or county-sponsored low-cost or free spay/neuter programs, including aggressive community education on the importance of voluntary spay/neuter. According to the Animal Population Control Study Commission, Minnesota Legislature, for every dollar invested in municipally operated spay/neuter clinics, taxpayers will save \$18.72 in future animal control costs over a ten-year period.
- 5. Provide low cost community educational clinics on proper pet care as a preventive measure for both children and adults.
- 6. Create community projects, such as dog parks and dog shows/events that spark interest in dogs and the human/animal bond.
- 7. Create and install a Dog Advisory Council to identify dog issues in the community as recommended by The American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA). An advisory council or task force that represents a wide spectrum of community concerns and perspectives creates a source of support for program initiatives.
